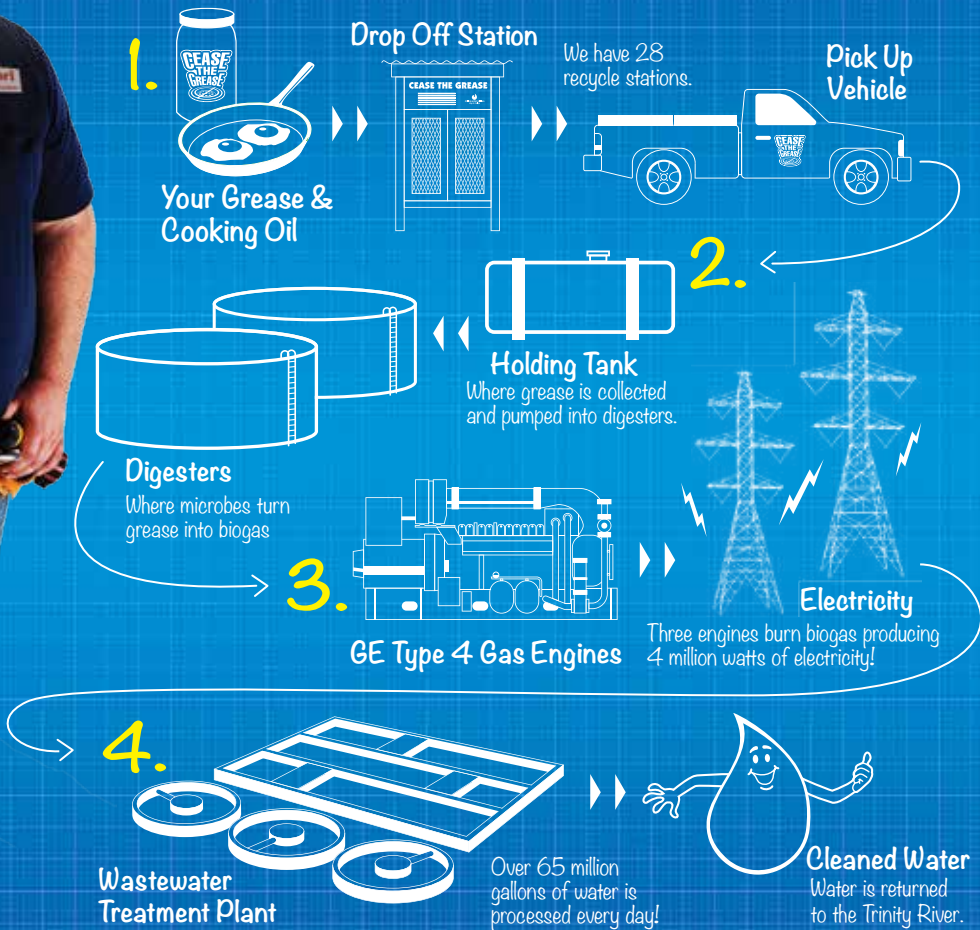


“We’re turning grease into electricity & cleaning water?”

That’s right, the City of Dallas is turning your recycled grease and cooking oil into electricity and cleaning the city’s water. Here’s how it’s done:

1. Your used grease and cooking oil dropped off at Cease the Grease recycle stations are transported to the Southside Wastewater Treatment Plant.
2. There the grease is put into a holding tank and slowly pumped into huge digester tanks where tiny microbes eat the grease and release methane, or biogas.
3. The biogas is then burned in large engines to create lots of electricity and heat.
4. That electricity and heat is then used to run the city’s wastewater treatment plant to turn stinky water into clean water.

And, who doesn’t want to help clean water?
